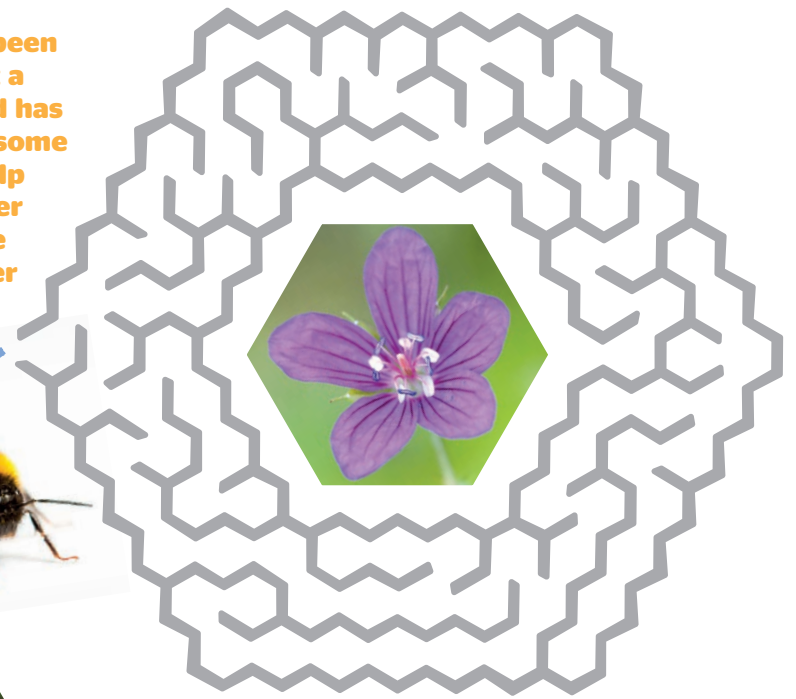




# POLLINATION PARTY TIME

Some invertebrates eat nectar and/or pollen. Whilst feeding at flowers, they get a dusting of pollen on their bodies, which they take to the next flower. The pollen rubs off and fertilises the flower, which is how seeds are made. Invertebrates that do this are called **pollinators**.
