

BIRDS TO SPOT IN BROMPTON CEMETERY



LONG-TAILED TIT

With a tail longer than its body, this sociable bird can be seen flitting from tree to tree in fast-moving flocks.



ROBIN

Arguably Britain's most loved bird, robins trail large mammals to exploit the insect prey revealed when animals disturb the ground.



GREAT TIT

The largest UK tit, it has a distinctive song described as like a bicycle pump or 'tea-cher tea-cher'!



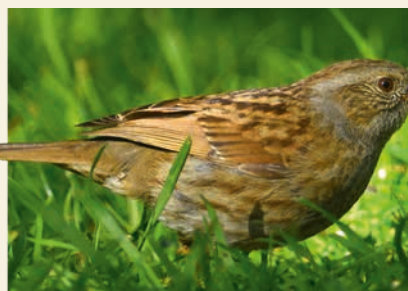
CARRION CROW

A common sight throughout the UK, carrion crows are extremely intelligent and highly adaptable, thriving in a range of habitats.



BLACKCAP

The park's most common warbler has a rich and fluty song; in spring males sing proudly from prominent spots.



HEDGE SPARROW

This secretive bird spends most of its time hopping about on the ground beneath scrub looking for insects.



CHAFFINCH

Chaffinches can form large flocks with other finch species to exploit abundant food resources. Despite being among the UK's most common bird species, between 2007-2018 chaffinches have declined by 30%.



WOOD PIGEON

Britain's most common species of pigeon. Like all pigeons, wood pigeons feed their young 'crop milk', a protein-rich liquid secreted from glands in the lining of the crop.
