

BIRDS TO SPOT IN GREENWICH PARK



HOUSE SPARROW

These opportunistic birds have been living alongside humans for centuries, often roosting and nesting in homes.



NUTHATCH

A very vocal, aggressive little bird that climbs up and down tree trunks like a mouse, in search of insects.



GREENFINCH

A once common bird in the UK, its numbers have declined rapidly due to a disease called trichomonosis.



CHIFFCHAFF

A type of 'leaf warbler' bird, so named because its colours match the leaves of trees and shrubs where it feeds.



STARLING

A communal bird with iridescent plumage. Starlings are best known for their murmuration's which take place in autumn and winter.



COMMON SWIFT

A summer visitor to the UK, it only lands to breed; you'll see swifts swooping and screaming overhead as if playing!



PIED WAGTAIL

With its long wagging tail, this small bird is often seen running across lawns or by water, searching for insects.



SONG THRUSH

Known for breaking open snails against stones, it has a beautiful song distinctive for its repeated phrases of notes.
