

RISK ASSESSMENTS

The Royal Parks welcomes filming and photography in the parks, however in order to comply with the law and ensure the safety of other park users, productions will be required to complete a written Risk Assessment before filming permission can be granted.

Regulation 3 of the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 requires that every employer / self-employed person make a suitable and sufficient assessment of:

- I. the risks to the health and safety of his employees to which they are exposed whilst they are at work
- 2. the risks to the health and safety of persons not in his employment arising out of or in connection with the conduct by him of his undertaking

In line with these requirements productions will be required to submit a Risk Assessment at the filming application stage. Further information on completing Risk Assessments can be found on the following website:
